The *Scott E. Shipley Memorial Career & Technology Scholarship* was established by his parents Raymond and Brenda Shipley, and brothers Steven and Travis after Scott's tragic death in November 2002. This scholarship is in honor and memory of their oldest son and brother. Scott graduated in 1992 from Westminster High School and the Career and Technology Center's (Carroll County Vo-Tech) Diesel Technology Program.

Scott had many opportunities growing up. He began to play the trumpet in second grade and excelled while in middle school, where he became part of the All County Band and Orchestra. He was a member of the Westminster Municipal Band. Scott played Little League Baseball and continued playing thru the Babe Ruth Program, as an outfielder and catcher.

Scott grew up in the trucking industry. His love for trucks and desire to learn at a very early age to work on CAT engines can be attributed to his dad, who was an owner/operator for the first thirteen years of Scott's life. Scott enrolled at the Career and Technology Center when he was in 11<sup>th</sup> grade and began learning his Diesel Technology skills. After graduation, Scott worked for RMS in Westminster, then as a mechanic at Hahn Transportation in

Union Bridge. In 1997, Scott became an engine mechanic at Alban Tractor and left that employment shortly before his death to do his second love, which was to drive a truck. While at Alban, customers would ask him to work on their equipment because of his skills.

Scott was a special person with a big smile and heart who gained admiration from his peers. His dream was to become a member of the family business as a mechanic and truck driver. It seems a seed was planted in Scott at a very early age to drive a truck someday, because so many other Shipley's have made their living in this way. To Scott it was simple, there should only be two types of trucks, Kenworth, and Pete, and one engine, CAT.

Because Scott learned so much while at the Carroll County Career & Technology Center his family wishes to honor his accomplishments by awarding a scholarship(s) to a student who has fulfilled the requirements in the Diesel Technology program and wants to enhance their capacities and capabilities in Diesel Technology.
